## **Program Objective:**

Transform your board into a driving force for your credit union's success with <u>CUES High-Performing Board Digital Series</u>. This comprehensive online seminar series supports credit union boards aspiring to enact best practices and achieve exceptional performance. ## **Series and Seminar Structure:**

Sessions are scheduled quarterly, occur over a three-week period, and require a total time commitment of five to six hours. During these three weeks, participants will attend <a href="two.ninety-minute-live-Zoom sessions">two.ninety-minute-live-Zoom sessions</a> and complete independent work designed to help participants reflect on the seminar's topic.

July 13	Live Presentation	The speaker will deliver a 90-minute presentation on the seminar's topic. (playback available)
July 13-20	Read and Reflect	Visit the CUES Learning Portal pathway and CUESNet Community online discussion board to engage with readings, case studies, or podcast episodes in preparation for the live discussion.
July 20	Live Discussion	The speaker and academic director will facilitate a 90-minute discussion related to the seminar's topic. (playback available)
